Sharing the Word

First Reading: (1 Kings 19: 16.19-21) This is part of a poem written after the return from the Babylonian exile. It paints a glowing picture of the blessings God will bestow on Jerusalem and its inhabitants. It likens Jerusalem to a mother who lovingly nurses her children. It foreshadows the blessings that will result from the coming of the Kingdom of God with Jesus.

Second Reading: (Galatians 6:14-18) Paul is attacking the Judaizers who would impose circumcision and the observance of the Mosaic Law on the Galatian Christians. Paul insists that the grace of God which is present in the cross of Christ is all we need. He points to the way by which he himself has participated in the cross of Christ.

Gospel: (Luke 9:51-62) The sending out of the 72 disciples was only a temporary mission, of short duration, and limited to the surrounding Jewish towns and villages. The main task of the mission is to proclaim the kingdom of God. The purpose of the mission is to make people think again about what was being offered them and the consequences of their refusal. Rejection of the disciples is rejection of Jesus. The disciples are delighted because they have been able to cast out demons using Jesus' name. But the real cause for rejoicing is the fact that the kingdom of Satan is being overthrown and the kingdom of God has come. The assurance of being numbered among the elect is the ultimate reason for rejoicing.
