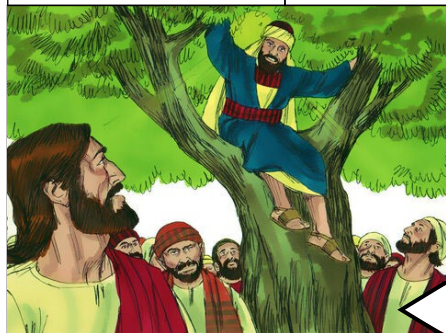

Sat 29 18:30	First Mass of Sunday Wellbeing for Giuseppina De Masi	<p>First Reading: The reading talks about God's power and mercy. The world and all it contains is like a grain of sand compared with the greatness of God. But God created humankind out of love. And because of his love, God does not desire the destruction or death of humankind. He is always ready to pardon their sins, desiring only that they repent and return to him. This theme is repeated in today's Gospel.</p> <p>Second Reading: Paul prays for the Thessalonians that God will make them worthy of his call and keep them steadfast in the pursuit of goodness. Then he turns his attention to the second coming of Christ. There seems to have been false rumours, purporting to be from Paul, that the Second coming had already taken place. Paul sets the matter right, and tells them not to get carried away.</p> <p>Gospel: At the time of Jesus tax collectors were put in the same category as thieves, murderers and prostitutes. And because they worked for the Romans, they were also regarded as traitors, and treated as outcasts. We can understand then how the people of Jericho were offended when Jesus went to the house of Zacchaeus. Jesus justified his action by saying that Zacchaeus too was a son of Abraham, and therefore had as much right to the mercy of God as any other Israelite. He declared that he had come to seek and save people like Zacchaeus. And touched by the kindness of Jesus, Zacchaeus saw the error of his ways and resolved to change. He will give his wealth to the poor.</p>
