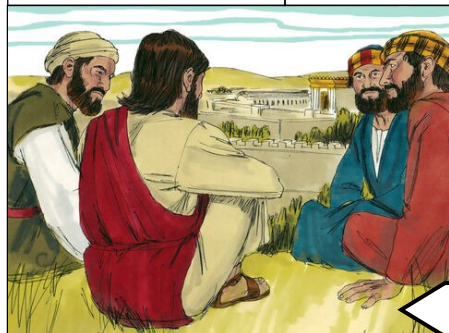

Sharing the Word

First Reading: As the liturgical year draws to a close, the focus is on the end of the world and the second coming of Christ. The prophet Malachi say that for evildoers the Day of the Lord will be a day of judgement; but for the upright it will be a day of salvation. This message was meant to act as warning to sinners and an encouragement to the just.

Second Reading: This also relates to the Second Coming. Some of the Thessalonians, believing that the Parousia was imminent, saw no need to work. Presenting himself as an example, Paul tells them to go on living and working as normal, and not be content to live off the community.

Gospel: Luke talks about the Parousia in close association with the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple. The destruction of the Temple, which Jesus had predicted, had already occurred by the time Luke was writing. This would have been interpreted by some as a sign that the end of the world was starting. But Luke reminds them of them of the words of Jesus, in which he warned his disciples not to be deceived by rumours and apparent sings that the end was near.

The gospel goes on to address a situation of more immediate concern to the disciples, the persecution they must face. Persecution will be an opportunity to bear witness to the Gospel. The Lord himself will see to it that they will triumph in the end, provided they remain steadfast.
