

Sharing the Word

Advent: Advent is a time when, as a Church, we journey together and realise our need for the Lord to save us. It is the same plea of the disciples to a sleeping Jesus on the storm-torn Sea of Galilee: "Save us, Lord, we are going down" (Mt 8:25). We all have our personal storms, where we tend to feel God is asleep in the middle of the messiness and mayhem of our lives. Our Church has been navigating a seemingly endless journey through choppy waters. Advent enables us to see the present world as a signpost to a larger reality. Advent gives us a glimpse of hope amidst the ruins in our lives. Advent anticipates and waits for Christ's return, who pledges a solemn promise to free us from all that corrupts and defaces our personal and collective lives. (SacredSpace)

First Reading: Today's passage from the prophet Isaiah contains a vision of a world at peace under God. We have the image of nations turning their weapons of war (swords and spears) into farm implements (ploughshares and sickles). But this can happen only when all nations come to the mountain of the Lord. It is Israel's task to focus attention on Yahweh, the merciful God who desires the unity of the nations. And so Israel is called to walk in the light of the Lord. The messianic blessings are meant for all the nations.

Second Reading: The theme is that of the second coming of Jesus. The first Christians believed that this was imminent. Paul urges the Romans to turn away from the darkness of evil, and to walk in the light of Christ.

The reading continues the theme of walking in the light of the Lord, which is mentioned in the first reading.

Gospel: The gospel emphasises the importance of readiness. Since the exact time of the Lord's coming is not known, the disciples are urged to be ready to greet him at any time. The phrases 'stay awake' and 'stand ready', convey a sense of urgency.
