#### Sharing the Word

**First Reading:** This is a message of hope for God's people in exile. God himself is coming to their rescue and will lead them back to Zion. The image of the desert made fertile by the rain is used to portray the confident hope that God would restore his people, crushed by misfortune. The crippling disabilities - blindness, deafness and lameness will be relieved when God sends salvation to his people.

**Second Reading:** St James is talking about the second coming of Jesus. He urges the kind of patience and hope farmers show in waiting for the harvest, and which the prophets of old showed as they waited for the promises to be fulfilled.

**Gospel:** John the Baptist had doubts about Jesus because he did not fit his image of the Messiah. Jesus dispelled John's doubts by showing that he was doing precisely the kind of things that had been predicted for the messianic times. "Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good news is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me."
