The readings we listen to on Ash Wednesday introduce us into the spirit of Lent. "Rend your hearts, not your garments," proclaims the Lord to the assembly gathered before him. (Joel 2:13). With its core disciplines of fasting, prayer and almsgiving, Lent is a time of preparing a people worthy of the Lord's special care. As much as we work on our individual hearts, Lent is also a time when we must work on the heart of the community, calling it to a change of life. During the season of Lent, the church "goes on retreat". It is a good time for self-reflection and spiritual exercises that lead to metanoia, a change of heart. One traditional path to metanoia is through acts of penance with prayer, fasting, and

almsgiving. Scripture emphasizes the mercy of God, the grace of God that changes hearts. Acts of penitence do not persuade God to be merciful; God's mercy leads us to be penitent. The prophet Joel urged the people to gather to beg God to deliver them from disaster. St Paul insists that the time to act is now. God reconciled the world to himself through Christ. When we accept God's gift of salvation, we not only are saved from sin but also become ministers of reconciliation ourselves. If we have truly embraced God's reconciliation, then we will live it. We will be patient, forgiving and peaceful. Jesus assumes that those who follow him will act uprightly and continue the traditional practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Our own prayer, fasting and almsgiving should be done only for God to see because they express and strengthen our relationship with God. We give alms as a symbol of all that God has given us. We fast because we hunger for God, and we don't look gloomy about it because we aren't gloomy. We are living for God. Lent is therefore a time of joy and an opportunity for spiritual renewal. We sing penitential psalms and hymns and listen to the rich stories of our faith.

### Clergy Support Fund: Second Collection Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> February

Next week we will be holding the Clergy Support collection. The Clergy Support Fund enables the Archdiocese of Southwark to care for priests in their retirement, old age, and at their time of ill health, after their lifetime of service and devotion to Christ, His Church and His People.

In 2022, the Clergy Support Fund provided care to 73 retired priests, at a cost of £1.33 million. With the number of priests over the age of 65 steadily increasing, so too will the financial obligation to the Archdiocese.
