Sharing the Word First Reading From now until Pentecost the first reading is taken from Acts of the Apostles. Luke is concerned with showing the triumphal progress of the Gospel throughout the whole known world. The power behind this progress is the Holy Spirit. Today's reading is part of Peter's sermon in the house of the Roman centurion Cornelius. Peter gives a brief account of the ministry of Jesus and concludes with the narrative of his death and resurrection. Peter stresses that he and his companions were witnesses to all this. And now they have been sent to proclaim the risen Jesus to be judge of the living and the dead. Second Reading This can be seen as a message for the newly baptised, but it applies to all the baptised. Christians die and rise with Christ at the moment of their baptism. Therefore, we must seek the things of heaven rather than the things that belong to the earth. We must live, not by the world's standards, but model ourselves on Christ. Gospel The gospel is full of symbolism. The darkness of the first day of the week, evokes the darkness of Genesis 1. Suggesting that Jesus's death is the prelude to a new creation.
